

## SCHEDULE & TUITION

### **Daily Schedule**

Brook Road Academy operates on a modified block schedule. Mondays and Wednesdays are “A” days; Tuesdays and Thursdays are “B” days. Fridays alternate between “A” and “B” days. Most classes meet for 90 minutes every other day and alternating Fridays for a full year. Some classes meet for 90 minutes everyday for one semester. Both scenarios provide the instructional time required to earn a course credit for high school as well as meet the required instructional time for middle school courses. The Head of Academy will review a sample daily schedule with the applicant and his/her family.

School building opens at 7:50a.m. Classes begin at 8:20a.m.; dismissal is at 3:30p.m. The school building remains open until 4:30 p.m. A faculty member supervises students in the building until pick up. Students who are not picked up at the time of dismissal are expected to remain with the faculty member in a supervised study hall.

### **Tuition**

Annual tuition is \$13,000. This amount does not include the fees listed above. Tuition may be paid in 1,2, or 3 installments. There is a surcharge for payment by installments. The installment amounts and due dates will be reviewed with families during their meeting with the Head of Academy.

### **Food Service**

Students are responsible for bringing their own lunches. Lunches can also be purchased through St. Joseph's Villa's culinary services at a price of \$4.00 per day.
